Remote Accessible Vote by Mail System

CACEO POSITION:	Watch
SUMMARY:	Requires a county elections official, beginning January 1, 2020, to permit a voter with a disability, or a military or oversees voter, to cast his or her ballot using a certified remote accessible vote by mail system. Provides that the requirements would not apply to a county when conducting an all-mailed ballot election, as specified.

SUMMARY:	Requires the Secretary of State to establish an Internet Web site that displays the names and contact information, including the phone number, email address, and office address, of each voter's local, state, and federal elected officials, which would be displayed upon a voter submitting his or her address information on the Internet Web site. Provides that it shall not be construed to prohibit the Secretary of State from exercising his or her authority under existing law to implement the bill's provisions.

*AB 1479 Public Records: Custodian of Records: Civil Penalties

CACEO POSITION:	Opposed
SUMMARY:	Requires, until January 1, 2023, public agencies to designate a person or persons, or office or offices to act as the agency's custodian of records who is responsible for responding to any request made pursuant to the California Public Records Act and any inquiry from the public about a decision by the agency to deny a request for records. Authorizes a court, until January 1, 2023, that finds by preponderance of the evidence that an agency, knowingly and willfully without substantial justification, failed to respond to a request for records that were clearly subject to public disclosure, unreasonably delayed providing the contents of a record subject to disclosure in whole or in part, or improperly assessed a fee upon a requester that exceeded the direct cost of duplication, or otherwise did not act in good faith to comply with these provisions, to assess a civil penalty against the agency in a specified amount. Makes legislative findings. Makes other conforming changes.

*SB 149 Presidential Primary Elections: Ballot Access

CACEO POSITION:	Watch
SUMMARY:	Enacts the Presidential Tax Transparency and Accountability Act. Requires a candidate for President, in order to have his or her name placed upon a primary election ballot, to file his or her income tax returns for the five most recent taxable years with the Secretary of State, as specified. Requires the Secretary of State, after adopting regulations, to redact the income tax returns of Presidential candidates as necessary to protect individual privacy, as specified, and subsequently to make the returns available to the public on the Secretary of State's Internet Web site.
