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

COMPLAINT FOR TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER, PRELIMINARY AND PERMANENT INJUNCTIONS, AND DECLARATORY RELIEF

Tom Cleary, individually and the California Republican Party, an Unincorporated Association, for cause of action against Defendant, allege as follows:

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

Temporary Restraining Order, Preliminary and Permanent Injunctions

1. Plaintiff Tom Cleary is, and at all times herein mentioned was, a United States citizen, eighteen years of age, a resident and duly registered voter in the County of San Diego, State of California.

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- Plaintiff California Republican Party (hereinafter "CRP") is, and at all times herein mentioned was, an unincorporated association for the California State Republican Central Committee, the official state organization of the Republican Political Party recognized under the Elections Code.
- Plaintiff Tom Cleary as a citizen registered to vote 3. in San Diego County, and the CRP as the official state organization of the Republican political party, have a First Amendment right to a fair and impartial vote of the electorate, and have further interest in the procedures of the San Diego County Registrar's Office in conducting state and county elections in such a manner as to insure the accuracy and integrity of elections, and protect their First Amendment rights.
- Plaintiffs are informed and believe, and based thereon allege that Defendant is now, and at all times mentioned herein was, the duly appointed, qualified and acting Registrar of Voters of the County of San Diego. As the chief election official of that County, the Defendant has the duty to insure that the state election laws are fully and faithfully enforced. Elections Code §§1013 and 1017 set forth certain strict and specific requirements for the return of ballots to the Registrar's Office by absentee voters, or by third persons on Section 1013 requires that an absent behalf of absent voters. voter who, because of illness or other physical disability, is unable to return the ballot, may designate specified persons

including his or her spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, brother or sister to return the ballot to the County Registrar's Office or to the precinct board at any polling place within the County's jurisdiction. Section 1017 provides for emergency procedures in instances where a voter is unable to go to the polls because of illness, disability, or physical handicap. Such a voter may request in a written statement, signed under penalty of perjury, that a ballot be delivered to him or her, even though the period allowed to obtain absentee ballots by mail may have expired. Under such circumstances, the ballot shall be delivered by election officials to any authorized representative of the voter who presents this written statement to the official. Section 1017 further requires that the voter shall return the ballot, personally or through the authorized representative, to either the elections official or any polling place within the jurisdiction.

allege that Defendant has refused and continues to refuse to fully enforce Election Code §§1013 and 1017 by failing to institute and supervise a proper verification procedure to prohibit the unauthorized personal return of absent voters' ballots, at the Election Department Office, and at precinct and polling places, in upcoming primary and special elections in San Diego County. This failure and refusal to comply and fully enforce §§1013 and 1017 of the Elections Code could result in the illegal return of absent voters' ballots by unauthorized

- 6. On or about June 3, 1990, the CRP demanded that Defendant fully comply with Elections Code §§1013 and 1017 and take appropriate steps to insure that absent voter ballots are returned only by authorized persons. The procedures demanded were to log the name of the person returning the ballot, his or her relationship to the voter, whether the cause for the third party return is illness or disability of the voter, or whether the ballot is returned under the Elections Code §1017 emergency procedures. Defendant has refused and still refuses to take such steps or other steps as are appropriate and necessary to enforce the provisions of Election Code §\$1013 and 1017, and to otherwise fully insure that only authorized persons return absent voters' ballots.
- 7. Defendants continued failure and refusal to fully comply and enforce §§1013 and 1017, unless and until enjoined and restrained by order of this Court, will cause great and irreparable injury to Plaintiffs in that the illegal return of absent voters' ballots by unauthorized persons could occur which could also affect both election outcomes and the integrity of the elections process.
- 8. Plaintiffs have no adequate remedy at law for the injuries which are threatened in that it will be impossible for Plaintiffs to determine the precise amount of monetary damages,

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if any, which they will suffer if the integrity of the elections process or the outcome of such elections are adversely affected.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

Declaratory Relief

- 9. Plaintiffs hereby incorporate by this reference paragraphs 1 through 8, inclusive, as though fully set forth herein.
- plaintiffs are informed and believe and thereon allege that an actual controversy has arisen and now exists between Plaintiffs and Defendant concerning their respective rights and obligations under Election Code §§1013 and 1017 in that Plaintiff contends that Defendant is required to ascertain the identity of all persons delivering absent ballots on behalf of absent voters, to ascertain the relationship of such persons to the absent voter and whether the cause for third party returns is illness or disability of the voter, and to verify their authorized representative capacity to deliver such ballots on behalf of the absent voter in accordance with the emergency procedures of §1017. Whereas Defendant disputes these contentions and contends that the election officials are not required under §§1013 and 1017 to ascertain and record the relationship between an absent voter and persons delivering absent ballots on their behalf, or to verify that such persons delivering an absent ballot is the authorized representative on whose behalf the voter initially obtained the ballot. Defendant further contends that merely logging the name of the person

returning the ballot, without requiring proof of identification is sufficient to enforce §§1013 and 1017.

- 11. Plaintiffs desire a judicial determination of their rights and duties, and a declaration as to which parties' interpretation of Election Code §§1013 and 1017 is correct.
- 12. A judicial declaration is necessary and appropriate at this time under the circumstances in order that Plaintiffs may ascertain their rights under Election Code §§1013 and 1017.

 Until such a declaration is rendered, Plaintiffs cannot be confident in the integrity of the election process or the accuracy of election outcomes.
- 13. Plaintiffs have demanded that Defendant take such steps as are necessary and adequate to verify the authorized status of each person delivering absent ballots on behalf of absent voters. Defendant has refused to take such steps beyond merely recording the name of persons delivering ballots to the Registrar's Office and/or polling places on election day. Defendant has refused and continues to refuse to take additional steps to obtain further information relating to such person's relationship to the absent voter and whether such persons were the authorized representative on whose behalf the voter previously obtained the ballot from the election officials.

WHEREFORE Plaintiffs pray judgment as follows:

1. AS TO THE FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION:

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- For an order requiring Defendant to show cause, if any she has, why she should not be enjoined as hereinafter set forth, during the pendency of this action;
- For a Temporary Restraining Order, a Preliminary Injunction, and a Permanent Injunction, all enjoining Defendant and her agents, servants, and employees, and all persons acting under, in concert with, or for Defendant:
- To institute and enforce a verification procedure at her office and at all San Diego County precinct polling places, with respect to all absent voters' ballots returned in person to the County Election Department and all precinct polling locations in San Diego County, with such procedures to include requesting and recording the following information: the name and identity of the person delivering the absent voter: the relationship, if any, such person has to the absent voter, including whether they are his or her spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, brother or sister; whether they are designated by the absent voter to return the ballot because the voter is unable to do so by reason of illness or physical disability; or whether the ballot is returned under Elections Code §1017 emergency procedures; and
- To hold all absent voters ballots returned . (2) to her office or to precinct polling locations in San Diego County which do not contain postmarks, and counting the same only after verifying compliance with Elections Code §§1013 and 1017.

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- C. For costs of suit and attorneys fees in accordance with Code of Civil Procedure §1021.5; and
- D. For such other and further relief as the Court deems proper.

2. AS TO THE SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION:

- A. For a declaration that:
- Defendant to enforce such provisions by instituting a verification procedure at her office and at all San Diego County precinct polling places, with respect to all absent voters ballots returned in person to the County Elections Department and all precinct polling locations in San Diego County, with such procedures to include requesting and recording the identity of persons delivering absent ballots on behalf of an absent voter, and their relationship to such voter including whether they are the voter's spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, brother or sister, whether they are returning the ballot on behalf of the absent voter by reason of the voter's illness or other physical disability, and whether the ballot is returned under the Elections Code §1017 emergency procedures.
- (2) Defendant shall hold all absent voters' ballots returned to her office or to precinct polling locations in San Diego County which do not contain postmarks, and count the same only after verifying compliance with Elections Code \$\$1013 and 1017.
