AB 1596 (Garcia) - SUPPORT

Dear Assembly Member Garcia:

The California Association of Clerks and Elections Officials wishes to advise you that it is pleased to support AB 1596, which would require printed vote-by-mail applications to be addressed to the appropriate election official rather than to a third party.

This bill will facilitate and speed the processing of vote-by-mail applications by by-passing intermediaries who delay election officials' receipt of the request. The bill does not preclude individuals and organizations from gathering vote-by-mail applications by means other than through the mail which does not hamper their right to conduct vote-by-mail campaigns while retaining the 72 hour requirement for the applications to be submitted to the appropriate election official.

This bill will permit election officials to mail, in a timely manner, ballots to those requesting them which can often be an issue as the election nears.

We appreciate your leadership and thoughtful consideration of issues important to our association and your support of efforts to streamline and make election processes more secure and efficient.
