AB 1873 (Gonzales) Support If Amended

Dear Assembly Member Gonzalez:

The California Association of Clerks and Election Officials has reviewed **AB 1873** and is pleased to offer its **support if amended** to address a few concerns. We appreciate your proposal which provides counties an option to conduct special vacancy elections for congressional and legislative offices by primarily mail ballot and provides options for cities to conduct special mail ballot elections for city measures.

Currently, existing California Election law requires special vacancy elections for congressional and legislative offices to be conducted using a primarily polling place format. These special vacancy elections have historically had low voter turnout, yet the cost to conduct them is exorbitantly high and counties bear the full cost. In 2013 alone, thirteen (13) special state legislative vacancy elections were held costing approximately \$17,500,000.

California's voting behavior is changing and as experienced in the November 2012 Presidential General Election, the majority of voters are voting by-mail. This is more evident in special elections where the percentage of mail ballot voters is even greater than the percentage of polling place voters. We favor having a mail ballot local option and propose the following amendments to address our concerns:

- Under 4000.5(3)(A), delete the dropoff per city provision and instead use a 100,000 (suggested) registered voters per dropoff location formula. Also, amend language from "beginning 21 days" to "at a minimum of 7 days". This will provide sufficient flexibility to election officials to determine the size and extent of the special election.
- 2) Delete 4000.5(3)(B) regarding unincorporated dropoff locations. The requested amendment above will address all areas within the jurisdiction.
- 3) Delete 4004(d). By striking this provision, it will allow cities to work with their county election official to determine the best course to consolidate the election.
