SUMMARY:	Deletes the requirement that the ordinance describes the boundaries, and number, of each legislative district and would instead require the legislative body, or the proponents of the initiative measure, to prepare a proposed map describing the boundaries and numbers of the legislative districts after the ordinance is passed or enacted, as specified. Requires a legislative body changing from a from district method of election to a by district method of election, or adjusting the district boundaries, to hold public hearings on the change, as specified. Makes numerous technical nonsubstantive changes to these provisions. Requires the districts to comply with the applicable provisions of the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965. Extends existing law that authorizes the legislative body of a city, as specified, to adopt an ordinance that requires the members of the legislative body to be elected by district or by district with an elective mayor without submitting the ordinance for voter approval, regardless of its population.
