CACEO POSITION:	To be discussed
SUMMARY:	Deletes the requirement that the ordinance state the number of legislative districts describes the boundaries, and number, of each legislative district and would instead require the legislative body to prepare a proposed map describing the boundaries and numbers of the legislative districts after the ordinance is passed or enacted, as specified. Requires a legislative body changing from a from district method of election to a by district method of election, or adjusting the district boundaries, to hold public hearings on the change, as specified. Makes numerous technical nonsubstantive changes to these provisions. Requires the districts to comply with applicable provisions of the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965. Extends existing law that authorizes the legislative body of a city, as specified, to adopt an ordinance that requires the members of the legislative body to be elected by district or by district with an elective mayor without submitting the ordinance for voter approval, regardless of its population.

SUMMARY:	Permits a candidate for Member of the Legislature to file a statement with the Secretary of State in which the candidate voluntarily agrees that, if elected, he or she will continue to reside within the district from which he or she was elected during his or her term of office. Authorizes the Secretary of State to post on his or her Internet Web site voluntary statements of continuing residency filed with the secretary, as described.

Provides that the information Legislative Counsel makes available to the public pursuant to existing law is within the public domain and the State of California retains no copyright or other proprietary interest in that information. Requires the written response demonstrating that the record in question is exempt under an express provision of the act also to identify the type or types of record withheld and the specific exemption that justifies withholding that type of record.

Prohibits a person designated to return a vote by mail ballot from receiving any form of compensation, as defined, based on the number of ballots that the person has returned and prohibits an individual, group, or organization from providing compensation on this basis. States that any person in charge of a vote by mail ballot who knowingly and willingly engages in criminal acts related to that ballot is subject to the appropriate punishment pursuant to existing law.

SUMMARY:	Authorizes the governing body of a local agency to permit a candidate for nonpartisan elective office in the local agency to prepare a written statement for electronic distribution if the elections official who is conducting the election permits electronic distribution of a candidate's statement. Requires the statement to be posted on the Internet Web site of the elections official, permit the statement to be included in a voter's pamphlet that is electronically distributed, and prohibit the statement from being included in a voter's pamphlet that is printed and mailed to voters. Requires the elections official to provide a Spanish translation to those candidates who wish to have one. Requires the notice in the heading of the first page of the voter's pamphlet, in certain circumstances, to specify that additional statements are available on the Internet Web site of the elections official. Deletes the requirement that the notice appear in heavy-faced gothic type.

Requires that a person affirmatively agree to become registered to vote during a transaction with the department in order for his or her records to constitute a completed affidavit of registration.

Defines a "remote accessible vote by mail system" as a mechanical, electromechanical, or electronic system and its software that is used for the sole purpose of marking an electronic vote by mail ballot remotely, outside a polling location, for a voter with disabilities or a military or overseas voter who would then be required to print the paper cast vote record to be submitted to the elections official. Makes conforming changes.

Prohibits the summary from exceeding 75 words for each question and would authorize the summary information to be included in the voter information portion of the sample ballot.

SUMMARY:	Prohibits a State Senator or Member of the Assembly who decides to resign from office before the expiration of his or her term from subsequently using campaign funds held in trust for any purpose other than paying outstanding campaign debts or reasonable expenses. Amends the list of specified purposes allowable for the use of surplus campaign funds to include the payment of expenses to hold a special election to fill the vacancy created by the Member's resignation. Requires the former Member to pay from his or her surplus campaign funds such election-related expenses, to the extent he or she has funds available to do so. Provides that once election-related expenses are paid, the use of excess surplus funds to certain purposes would be limited. Makes a member who, after deciding to resign, uses campaign funds for purposes other than those authorized in that circumstance personally liable for expenses to hold a special election.

Requires the secretary to ensure that any confidential information or data provided by another state remains confidential while in his or her possession, and would authorize the secretary to transmit confidential information or data pursuant to that agreement. Authorizes the Secretary of State to adopt regulations necessary to implement these provisions.

Defines paroles as a term of supervision by the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation. Clarifies that conviction does not include a juvenile adjudication. Provides for required information to be provided in a program to encourage the registration of electors. Requires the furnishing of the names of incarcerated individuals.

SUMMARY:	Authorizes a city or city and county to propose an amendment to its charter that would allow a person who is at least 16 years of age at the time of the next election to vote in a school district governing board election, as specified, in which he or she would be qualified to vote based on residence. Authorizes, in the event that a city or city and county amends its charter as described, a person who is at least 16 years of age at the time of the next election, and who is otherwise qualified, to register to vote for the limited purpose of voting in a school district governing board election. Requires, if a city or city and county amends its charter, the city or city and county to enter into an agreement, as specified, with the county elections official providing for payment by the city, city or county, or school district of all costs necessary to implement the charter amendment or, alternatively, require that the city, city or county, or school district perform any or all duties necessary to implement the charter amendment, unless prohibited by law. Provides that a charter amendment adopted pursuant to these provisions with an effective date on or after January 1, 2017, is valid regardless of the date the charter amendment was approved. Provides that specified provisions shall become operative only if the Secretary of State certifies that the state has a statewide voter registration database that complies with the requirements of the federal Help America Vote Act of 2002.

Authorizes a county, city, special district, or school district to impose a limitation that is different from the limitation imposed by this Act. Requires enforcement standards. Makes a violation of the contribution limitation a misdemeanor subject to penalties.

Prohibits an elected or appointed officer of a state or local agency, while holding office and for a period of one year after leaving office, from engaging in specified conduct, including maintaining employment with, as specified, or being a compensated consultant of that agency or, for compensation, aiding, advising, consulting with, or assisting an entity with a permit, regulatory action, or enforcement action pending before the agency.

Decreases to 22 months the amount of time the certified statement of election results must be posted and maintained on the elections official's Internet Web site. Requires a county elections official to propose a modification of its voting system to the Secretary of State by December 31, 2017, for approval if modification of that system would enable the county to post required information on its Internet Web site immediately following the election, as specified. Prohibits the Secretary of State from certifying or conditionally approving a voting system after December 31, 2017, that is not capable of generating information contained in the statement of the result in both downloadable spreadsheet and Election Markup Language (EML) formats and enabling data to be transferred from this system to an external digital medium, as specified.

Prohibits a Member of the Legislature who vacates his or her seat before the expiration of the term of office for other than personal medical reasons from lobbying, for compensation, before the Legislature until 12 months have passed from the date his or her term of office would have expired.
