Once again, share YOUR solutions to recurring problems faced by Clerks of the Board around California. Feel free to bring copies of your solutions for other clerks to take home. Bring your problems, too, and go home with a solution!

- What procedures do you follow and what Web tools do you use to post Form 806 (Agency Report of Public Official Appointments) on the Web? How do you handle amendments?
- Does your office share databases with the assessor's office or do you have a system that allows limited data sharing? What do you use? What types of partnerships have been formed between clerks and assessors?
- How will you respond to future legislative requirements to post documents on the Web?
 (Sure as anything, the Legislature will add to your load!) What software and procedures do you use and follow to post agendas and records on your Web site?
- How do you deal with assessment appeals where the parties have repeatedly asked for continuances? Do you have a limit? If the parties exceed the limit, do you make the parties go before the board to make the request?
- Follow-up on succession planning: Have you made progress on succession planning? Have you tried anything new and different? Is succession planning *required* by your county? *Bring your plan to share with others*.
- If you have multiple assessment appeals boards, do you make any attempt to get the boards to render uniform decisions or do you simply get them to at least follow uniform procedures?
- Update the group with progress you have made in integrating old records into your electronic records system? What progress have you made in digitizing your records?

- If your AAB members prepare findings of fact (not county counsel), what measures do you have in place to monitor their performance? Do you limit the amount of compensated time board members have in which to complete findings?
- In May the FPPC adopted new Regulation 18313.6 to require a Form 700 filing officer to redact specified personal information of a public official, or relative of a public official, from a Form 700 that is posted on the Web if requested by a public official who has "a reasonable privacy concern". Have you implemented this regulation? Do you require a written request from the public official?
- How have you implemented AB 1344 (Ch. 692 of 2011) that requires a clerk to post on the Web the agenda of any legislative body (ccb's) whose members are compensated and whose membership includes a member of a governing body (BOS, city counsel, school board, etc.)?
- What BOE-standardized forms do your AAB staff and boards use? What county forms do you use in the AAB process? *Bring samples to share!*
- Follow up on ADA compliance: Have you found inexpensive ways to make your agenda ADA compliant? What progress have you made this year?
- Other than doing a Maddy Act posting for a vacancy, how does your county recruit assessment appeals board members?
- How do you handle minute orders? Do you do minutes at all? What time/money saving suggestions do you have?
- Have any counties begun using Megabyte's AAB module since last year's demo? What has been your experience? Is anyone using other recently developed tools for AAB tracking?
