Secretary Bowen discussed the following Agenda items.

1. USPS- Post Office has reversed their policy about not allowing VRC's in their post office lobbies. This topic will have to be revisited. Secretary Bowen said that this was a temporary reversal. Has anyone experienced any mail slow down? The following counties have: Glenn, Santa Cruz, San Joaquin, San Mateo, Monterey and Alameda, Please let Secretary of State's office know of any problems; phone Jana Lean or Evan Goldberg directly.

2. MOVE Act – Thanked Registrar's for getting UOCAVA ballots out timely and completing the three. DOJ is happy with our efforts.

3. Mock Election – October 30, 2012 in San Francisco. 1200 schools have signed up. If you want to see which schools have signed up go to the Secretary of States website.

4. Online Voter Registration - Has been up for 4 full weeks 544,000 applications have been submitted. Secretary of State Bowen thanked everyone for their patience and suggestions. There is a long list of suggestions to get through after the election and Secretary Bowen wants agrees with the suggestion that it should be a group effort. She accepted comments and suggestions from conference call attendees.
